Wildlife Order 2022

Portfolio

Conservation

On 14 April 2022, the Cabinet Legislation Committee:

- noted that on 10 March 2022 the Cabinet Environment, Energy and Climate Committee agreed that an Order in Council under section 8 of the Wildlife Act 1953 be made to enable existing commercial game preserves to continue operating, and to add three new areas to the list of game preserves listed in Schedule 3 of the Act [ENV-22-MIN-0009];
- 2 noted that the Wildlife Order 2022 will give effect to the decision referred to in paragraph 1 above:
- 3 noted that a waiver of the 28-day rule is sought:
 - so that the Wildlife Order 2022 can come into force on 6 May 2022, the date the 3.1 Wildlife Order 2019 expires;
 - 3.2 on the grounds that the Wildlife Order 2022 will have little or no effect on the public generally, and will confer only benefits on those members of the public who operate. or humon, commercial game preserves;
- 4 agreed to waive the 28-day rule so that the Wildlife Order 2022 can come into force on 6 May 2022)
- authorised the submission to the Executive Council of the Wildlife Order 2022 PCO 24679/4.01.
