Thank you for your request to the Department of Conservation, received on 11 March 2024, in which you asked for "all engineering reports, design statements, plans, concept plans, status reports, surveyed areas and the full Historic Prescient view and findings to allow lwi to make a meaningful contribution to the proposed changes" in relation to the Chateau Tongariro.

On 13 March 2024, you clarified your request to "all information that has been undertaken to determine its earthquake strengthening status and hence no longer used".

We have considered your request under the Official Information Act 1982.

We have identified documents within the scope of your request which are detailed in the table below.
