The goal of the walk is to notice as many pleasurable things as possible, slowly, one after another. Using all your senses—sight, smell, sound, touch... maybe even taste

- ▶ Find five different types of leaves – try different colours of green, shapes, textures and sizes
- ▶ Find a natural seat (comfy log or boulder) near water, and listen to the music it produces for five minutes
- ▶ Lift up a rotten log and see how many different insects are hiding
- ▶ Listen to a bird singing. Is its call repetitive or melodic? How many of that type of bird can you hear at once? Is it different to the last bird you heard?
- ▶ Turn over rocks in the stream and look for aquatic insects. There may be snails, mayflies or caddisflies
- ▶ Stop and observe the bark of trees around you. Close your eyes and feel their texture. How do they feel different?
- ▶ Take your shoes off and walk the track barefoot for a while – how different do you feel walking barefoot compared to wearing shoes?
- ▶ Take some deep breaths and concentrate on the smell of nature. Is it sweet, earthy, musky?
- ▶ Look for some flowers on the native trees. Often native trees have inconspicuous but delicate flowers
- ▶ Try to feel which way the wind is blowing, and identify what things move when the wind blows: leaves, grass, flowers, limbs, etc. Notice if there are any signs of wind's effects, like fallen leaves or branches
- ▶ See how many different types of seeds or fruit you can spot. Which trees did they come from?
- ▶ Look for moss. See how many examples of nature's carpet you can find!
