## MASON BAY OBSERVATION SHEET, TRAMPING EQUIPMENT

This will be a somewhat subjective judgement on behalf of the observer, although bias will be kept to a minimum by following these guidelines. The observer will remain the same throughout the study period.

- Keep a daily tally of the tramping equipment of each visitor. Note down whether the visitor is a day-tripper or an overnight tramper.
- Well-prepared **day trippers** should have sturdy footwear, suitable leg wear (e.g. not jeans), several layers of clothing including a rain jacket (may not be visible on sunny days), and a day pack (for lunch, etc.)
- Well-prepared **trampers** should have hiking boots or gumboots, suitable leg wear (this includes long johns, shorts or waterproof trousers), gaiters, several layers of clothing including a waterproof layer (may not be visible on sunny days), a tramping pack of suitable size and quality for the track.
- Other things to observe in the hut include cooking equipment, food provisions, sleeping bags, etc.


